ATTN: ALL MISSION TRIP PARTICIPANTS!!!! – The Mission Trip is Sunday, July 30th through Friday, August 4th. Please be aware that the state of New York requires a Tuberculosis test for any youth or adult working with children and / or the elderly population. If you have not had a TB test in the past two years, you will still be allowed to attend the trip however would be excluded from certain activities. Please take this into consideration and contact your family physician to schedule the test as needed. You will not need to provide proof of testing however you will need to complete the box on your participant release form stating the date that the test was taken and the outcome. IMPORTANT! Youthworks requires that ALL ADULT LEADERS AND STUDENT PARTICIPANTS 18 YEARS OLD AND OVER are required to complete a national / multi-state criminal background check and sex offender registry check. Arrangements have been made through the Stark County Educational Service Center 2100 38th St. NW Canton, Ohio 44709 to complete your finger printing. Please visit the home page @www.starkcountyesc.org scroll down to the finger print icon and you can schedule your apt at your convenience. You will need to take your driver's license / state ID and social security number with you. The cost of the background check will be covered under our mission trip budget. Lastly, your paperwork packets are now available. Please complete the required forms and return to me by July 2nd.

Last year we were able to provide 1,388 children with a voucher for \$65.00 for new clothes. Clothes shopping is supervised and approved by our volunteers. Please note that 100 percent of all donations go to the clothing vouchers. There are two ways to participate in the


