#### **SPIRITUALITY AND PRAYER**

Recently, I presented series of discussions on spirituality. I offer some key ideas for those who were unable to attend.

There are many styles of prayer almost as unique as he individual. Apart from the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, that there can be no prayer worthy of the believer. The Pirit plans within us the desire to pray and rest in the inner being of God.

Luther boldly asserted that "through prayer we share the almightiness of God." Christians who pray are helpers and saviors. Luther suggested that prayer should be "the first business of the morning and the last at night." Luther also added, "I do not know it or understand it, but sounding from above and ringing in my ears I hear what is beyond the thought of man."

Thomas Aquinas held that the frequency, not the length is the important issue in prayer. We should pray for what we believe could be God's final will or at least in accord with His will.

True prayer involves not simply pleading with God, but also wrestling with God in the darkness. Wrestling is not whining, for it springs from strength not weakness.

Prayer to be sure, involves submission to the will of God as well as importunity or petitioning. The surrender in prayer is not so much servile submission as seeking to bring our will in accord with His will.

For Calvin, supplication is opening up the treasures that God has stored for us in heaven. Not only must we be willing to act if our prayer is answered, we must seek to bring about the answer even as we pray. As Luther phrased it, "We pray for silver, but God often gives us gold."

The paradox of prayer that is not answered according to human expectation but that is fulfilled in the perspective of eternity.

St. Augustine understands prayer as "a loving gaze of the spirit directed towards God." John of Damascus defines prayer as the elevation of the mind and heart to God. For Thomas Merton, prayer is not essentially seeking communion with God, but rather realized communion in which we affirm what God gives.

Cardinal Newman confessed, "I am never less alone that when I am all alone."

As you can tell, prayer is a multi-faceted experience of God as we seek all that matters. I encourage all of you to be vigilant and persevering in prayer each day.


